LOCATION	Asessippi is located in the South Zone in the central western section of the PMH region. Bordered by Asessippi Provincial Park in the north and Riding Mountain National Park in the northeastern corner. It extends from the Town of Hamiota in the southeast corner to the Saskatchewan border in the west.

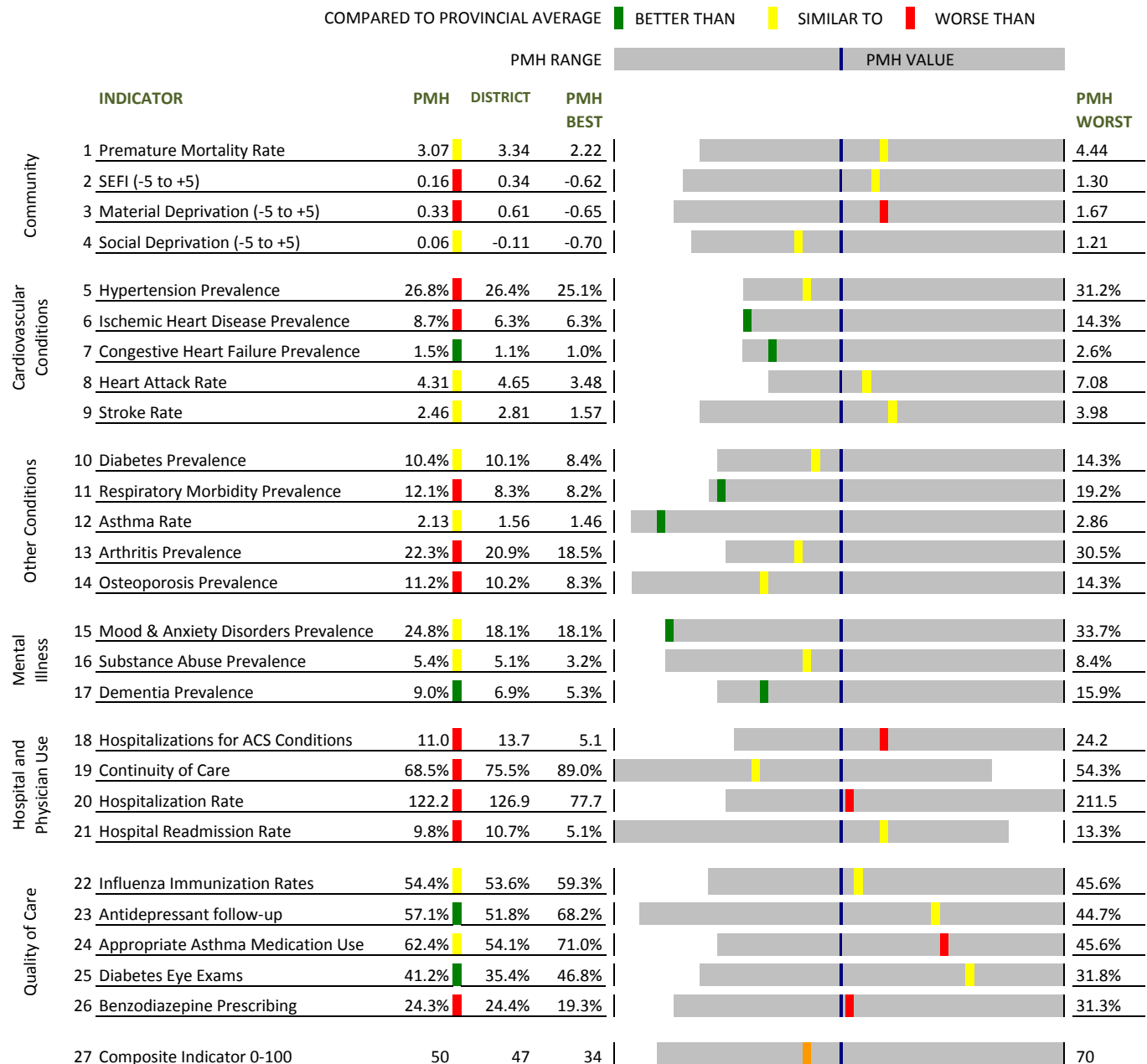

The PMH rate is shown as a blue vertical bar at the centre of the chart. The range of results for all of PMH is shown as the grey shaded area. The colour of the horizontal bar for both the district and PMH values indicates whether the value is significantly lower (green), significantly higher (red) or not significantly different (yellow) to the Provincial average.
